Differentiation:

Beginner

Tricky

Ten spellings split into blocks of five with separate word banks. Number of letters given. Words in the word banks are synonyms of spellings. One or two letters given in each spelling as a clue. Aimed at Year 5 Secure/Year 6 Emerging.

Expert

Ten spellings with one word bank. Number of letters given. Words in the word banks are synonyms of spellings. Aimed at Year 6 Developing.

Brainbox

Ten spellings with one word bank. Words in the word banks are synonyms of spellings. Aimed at Year 6 Secure.

Genius

Ten spellings without a word bank. Aimed at Year 6 Mastery.
