We hope you all had an enjoyable Easter break. We have a fun and exciting term of learning ahead of us and we hope you are looking forward to the challenges that are to come. This term we will be reading narrative poetry, looking at 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe', examining geometry and measure, exploring living things and healthy eating as well as enjoying some basketball, cricket, rounders and athletics in PE.



This term brings with it new challenges but also new opportunities for children to grow and learn. They are becoming more self-sufficient and widening their skill-set and we feel that now is the time to really push independence, using the 5 'B's and being critical of their learning and experiences.

Please may we gently remind you for this term that children should be wearing PE kit on a Monday and Friday and that normal school shoes should be worn on all other days.

### Home Learning

Maths and English home learning will support and consolidate the learning that has taken place in the classroom.

<b>Every day</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reading books and planners in school</li> </ul>	<p>We read in school every day for at least 10 minutes. Please ensure you have a book to read.</p>

### Reading

Reading is an essential part of your child's education. It is important that they read a wide range of books to develop their understanding and vocabulary. Please read with your child once a week and ensure they are reading for a minimum of 15 minutes a day. They need to write a short review of what they have read in their planners. Reading should be enjoyable and exciting. See the reading challenge on the website for book ideas.

### Multiplication and division facts

Times tables are the key to your child being a successful mathematician. It is important to continue to practise these even if they have learnt them, as they can easily be forgotten. There are many times table games online to play, along with apps and downloads to make them more accessible.

### Spellings

It is important for your child to practice their weekly spellings to ensure good spelling in their work and the development of their vocabulary. On the Class Page on our website there is a list of words they must know by the end of Year 6. It is good practice for your child to learn these in their spare time in order to improve their competency in spelling.

### Art and DT

This term we will be doing a range of art projects. Please make sure your child brings a large (adult sized), named smock/ old t-shirt to keep in school.

### Water bottles and snacks!

A reminder that your child must have a water bottle in school every day and **a fruit or veg snack** for break time.

**Home learning expectations** We expect home learning to be handed in on time. Please make sure they spend the allocated time and ensure they are presenting their work neatly. If your child has any issues with home learning, please make sure they speak to the teacher about it so that we are able to help them prior to the completion date

### What will we be learning this term?

<b>English</b>	Narrative poetry, recounts, fantasy narratives, adverts and modern verse poetry.
<b>Reading</b>	Whole class reader: The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe by C. S. Lewis. Reading foci: The industrial revolution, fantasy writing and rivers.
<b>Maths</b>	Geometry – property of shapes, position and direction, decimals, negative numbers, converting units and volume.
<b>Science</b>	Living things and animals including humans. Healthy eating and puberty.
<b>History &amp; Geography</b>	The Industrial Revolution. Rivers.
<b>RE</b>	What does it mean to live a good life? Gospel.
<b>PSHE</b>	Being my best. Growing and changing.
<b>Art and DT</b>	Sculpture. Producing musical instruments.
<b>Computing</b>	Introduction to vector graphics. Programming – a selection in quizzes.
<b>PE</b>	Basketball, cricket, rounders and athletics.
<b>Music</b>	Music of rivers.
